
Top Occupational Therapists: A. Jean Ayres, PhD, OTR

She did research through teaching and testing different tools with occupational therapy patients. She worked to reduce health disparities among her patients as well as her contributions to the Standardized Assessments Committee. She has published 4 books and more than 45 papers as the editor for the OTJR.
